

Our School Values




Dear Parents/Carers,

School Meals

Just a reminder to parents whose children are moving up from Year 2 into Year 3 – your child will no longer be eligible for Universal Free School Meals and therefore any lunches ordered will be charged at a cost of £2.45 per meal.

Any parents who feel they may qualify for Means Tested Free School Meals, then please collect an application form from the school office.

Healthy Snacks/Drinks

Please can we remind everyone that children are to have only healthy snacks for playtimes. Items such as fruit and cereal bars are great but no crisps or chocolate thank you, these should be kept for lunchboxes. Also, only water in drinks bottles please; this is to try and encourage good habits for the future. We are more than happy for a carton of fruit juice to be sent in to have at lunchtime when the children are also eating.



Parking

I can completely appreciate that the school run can be a stressful time. The last thing we want to do is make it harder, but it's really important for everyone's safety that you observe the rules and park safely. This is a friendly reminder that you need to be careful when parking around the school site. Safety for children is the most important thing for all of us. That is why it's a good idea to get to school early and look for somewhere safe and legal to park.

Please avoid parking on any yellow lines. Cars parked there can obstruct lines of sight for pedestrians who want to cross the road. Any car left unattended on a single or double yellow line for more than five minutes can be issued with a penalty charge notice.

In the interests of safety, you should never park on zigzag school markings. Any vehicle found on them can be again issued with a penalty charge notice. This also applies to Blue Badge Holders.

We enjoyed thinking of exciting adjectives to describe chocolate cake and then REALLY enjoyed eating some chocolate cake ourselves! Yum!


After this, we wrote instructions on how to make chocolate crispy cakes. Then we followed our instructions to bake our own!

We thought of special rules to help us stay safe in the sun such as drinking water and made a class poster to help us remember these rules!


Remember to Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek and Slide, have fun in the sun but don't get fried!



Girls Summer Uniform (Summer term and Autumn term up until October half term):

Red and white checked summer dress, logo or plain red jumper or cardigan, white or red socks, black/blue shoes or white/blue/black sandals

WINTER

Grey or black skirt, trousers or pinafore dress, white or red polo top with collar, logo or plain cardigan or jumper, black or blue shoes.

Boys Summer Uniform (Summer term and Autumn term up until October half term):

Grey shorts, white or red polo top with a collar, logo or plain red jumper/cardigan, white, grey, black or blue socks and black or blue shoes

WINTER

Grey or black school trousers, white or red polo top with a collar, logo or plain red school jumper, black or blue school shoes.

PE KIT both boys and girls

Red logo or plain PE t-shirt, red PE logo hoodie or plain red hoodie jumper, black PE school shorts. Black or blue joggers for colder months or wetter and cooler days.
