## Annual Governance Statement for the Local Governing Body of Antingham and Southrepps Primary School and Nursery October 2023

As a school, we focus on high quality teaching and learning which empowers every individual to acquire, demonstrate, articulate and value knowledge and skills so they become well-rounded citizens equipped for the challenges of the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

The Local Governing Body of Antingham and Southrepps Primary and Nursery has a focus on its three core strategic functions:

- 1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
- 2. Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its students, and the performance management of staff;
- 3. Awareness of the financial performance of the school.

Governance arrangements	<ul> <li>The Local Governing Body consists of two Parent Governors, one Staff Governor, five Community Governors and a Trust Director. The Headteacher is also a governor.</li> <li>There are Link Governors for Safeguarding, SEND, Pupil Premium, Finance, Wellbeing, Website as well as areas of the curriculum.</li> <li>The Governing Body meets half termly, a total of six meetings a year. Link governors meet with the relevant school staff on a regular basis depending on their link requirements. The Governing Body meets annually for a 'self-evaluation' exercise.</li> </ul>

The work that we have done	<ul> <li>Strategic development         A very successful Ofsted inspection took place in March. Governors attended meetings with the lead inspector to support HT and staff. The feedback meeting was attended and a 'GOOD' Ofsted grade was achieved. Inspectors stated that pupils 'were proud of their school and spoke positively about their experiences'.     </li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Transition to the Synergy Trust has enabled the school to benefit from being a member of a larger Trust and from staff and governor training and development. Governors have attended Trust-wide governance training sessions. The Chair of Governors attends termly meetings with other Chairs within the Trust to share best practice.</li> <li>Quality of education, particularly the curriculum Governors have been involved in supporting the Headteacher to ensure that the curriculum is cohesive and broad and balanced to meet the needs of all children in the school as recognised in the Ofsted report. Ofsted also recognised that pupils are attentive in class and readily support one another. Governors have received termly presentations from KS1 and KS2 teachers regarding the curriculum as well as regular updates from the SENDCo.</li> </ul>
• Educational performance Regular reports from the Headteacher enable Governors to monitor the educational performance of all children to ensure teaching and learning are reaching required standards.
<ul> <li>Monitoring         Governors have a termly monitoring programme linked to the school's development and improvement plan. Governors have met with their departmental links and undertaken monitoring of the following areas:         <ul> <li>Safeguarding</li> <li>Attendance</li> <li>SEND</li> <li>Staff wellbeing</li> <li>Pupil premium</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Finance</li> <li>Website</li> <li>Synergy Trust have provided detailed descriptions for the individual Link roles.</li> </ul>
Reports of visits are shared with the Governing Body. Deep dive visits were undertaken by Governors to look at the provision of English, Maths, Science and History in the school and feedback was given to the Headteacher and Subject Lead. Points made by Governors were reviewed and acted upon. Presentations were given also by the SENDCo, the Bushcraft Man and Thrive, keeping the Governing Board up-to-date.
<ul> <li>Feedback from children and parents         Feedback from children was obtained by Governors as part of         their monitoring visits and through attendance at school events.         Governors reviewed responses from the parent survey and         actions were identified. Parent Governors make themselves         available to listen to the views of parents at parent coffee         mornings and social events.     </li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Safeguarding         Safeguarding is monitored by the Safeguarding Governor on a termly basis and reports presented to the Governing Body at each meeting. Ofsted stated in their report that staff are well trained and briefed about safeguarding matters and that leaders place high importance on safeguarding. The Single Central Record is audited annually to ensure compliance and a report submitted to the Governing Body.     </li> </ul>

	<b>Key issues faced and addressed by the Local Governing Body</b> The annual self-evaluation exercise in October led to actions regarding link governor roles, the formation of the school vision and improvements in communication with parents and staff.
Future plans for the Local Governing Body	<ul> <li>Continue to strengthen Governors' relationship with the Headteacher and new teaching staff.</li> <li>Conduct the annual self-evaluation of the Governing Body and develop an action plan for the coming year.</li> <li>Construct a Governor monitoring programme to monitor SIDP priorities.</li> <li>Continue to monitor the embedding of the curriculum.</li> <li>Extend opportunities for Governor training through Synergy Trust and develop links with other Governors within the Trust to share expertise.</li> <li>To support the school in setting up a parent and toddler group with the aim of increasing school numbers.</li> </ul>
